



## FAQ Corona – What do I need to know?

---

Dear Parents,

With the following document we will try to answer as many questions as possible, so that you hopefully end up with a good feeling about sending your child to Camp.

### 1. Does my child have to bring a face mask to camp?

Yes! It is generally planned that all activities can take place with an appropriate distance or in small groups so that they can be carried out without wearing a mouth and nose protection. However, it could still happen that children from different cohorts meet in certain situations in which a sufficient distance cannot be maintained. Face masks are also needed when entering the canteen and for possible doctor's visits. For those reasons, we kindly ask you to provide your child with a sufficient amount of medical or FFP2 masks.

### 2. Will the counsellors wear mouth/nose protection?

The counsellors will wear mouth and nose protection whenever required, for example if it is not possible to maintain a sufficient distance during activities or if there is contact with other cohorts. Within the cohort, however, masks do not need to be worn.

### 3. Do parents have to wear face masks during drop off and pick up?

Yes please! We will try to set up our check-in area outdoors to make it easier to maintain the appropriate social distance. However, since we cannot predict the weather, it may happen that check-in is relocated to an indoor area plus at times it will get very busy at check-in. For this reason, we kindly ask you to wear a face mask and to keep a sufficient distance of 1,5m to other families.

### 4. What will the health check on arrival look like?

On arrival, all students have to present a negative result of a rapid Antigen Test, that is not older than 24 hours. At our bigger camps in the Lüneburger Heide and the Bavarian Forest we set up our own test centers for your children to enable them to get tested upon arrival at camp free of charge. All families who are booked in for those camps will receive a link by email to register online for this service prior to arrival at camp. Parents are also welcome to register and to get tested at camp if they wish to have a look at the premises. Additionally, we kindly ask you to inform us about any allergies or illnesses your child may have (e.g. pollen allergy) so that the symptoms of the allergies are not mistaken for the Coronavirus in case you have not already done so in the allergy and illnesses section of the questionnaire. We would highly appreciate if you could speak to your children about the utter necessity of reporting to a counsellor in case they are feeling unwell or are showing any signs or symptoms of illnesses that could point to a Coronavirus infection before camp starts. This is for the protection of everyone present at camp!

### 5. Regular Corona tests at camp

All students should expect regular tests during their stay at camp. How often this is going to happen depends on the latest regulations issued by the local governments. For sure we also need to test students/cohorts whenever there is a suspected case or if students show any symptoms. We recommend that you give us permission on the attached Check-in Form that our trained staff will be allowed to test your children at camp. This service is free of charge. Alternatively children can test themselves under the supervision of our staff but in that case parents have to provide them with a sufficient number of tests. Regular tests are obligatory for the participation in our summer camps. Exceptions are only made if students provide a proof of a complete vaccination against Covid-19 or a proof of recovery from the disease within the last six months.

### 6. Does my child need to bring hygiene-utensils (disinfectant/disposable gloves)?

No. There will be enough disinfectant available at Camp. After use, rooms and sports equipment (e.g. kayaks, climbing gear) will be cleaned and disinfected. Special attention will also be paid to regular hand-washing before and after activities, courses and meal times.



## 7. Best possible statements on group sizes and over all capacities

- **Cohorts:** One cohort will consist of 10 to 35 children of the same age-group housed in two to four tents, huts, or rooms. Each of those cohorts will be assigned their own counsellors, who will be responsible for those children. Within the cohort there will be no limit of contact. Most of the activities will be conducted within the confines of the cohort.
- **Accommodation:** The capacity of the accommodation (tents, huts, rooms) depends on the size and the official requirements of the respective federal state. In general, most of the Camps will be running at a capacity of approximately 80%.
- **Sanitary facilities:** Here the capacity also depends on the size of the facility itself. The max. allowed capacity will be signposted outside the facilities. In order to avoid bottlenecks, the cohorts will be put on a rota and be assigned to specific shower times. Of course, the sanitary facilities will be regularly disinfected, aired, and cleaned.
- **Meal times:** The cohorts will eat together with their counsellors in our dining halls or, if the weather allows it, in the adjoining outdoor areas. Due to the size of our facilities it will be possible for multiple cohorts to eat at the same time with an appropriate social distance. Nevertheless, we will be working with fixed times. The food will be served by our staff members and all children have to wear masks when collecting their food.
- **Activities/games:** Generally, we try to have all activities take place outdoors, in order to minimize the risk of an infection. Within their cohorts the children can be a bit more relaxed and play without social distancing. When mixing with other groups the distance of at least 1,5m must be kept between the different cohorts and a face mask might be needed for some activities.

## 8. How will activities be chosen within a cohort?

There will be a plan, in which the activities of each cohort will be assigned. The program for the cohorts will be arranged as such, so that every child has the possibility, throughout the week, to take part in every activity at least once. As the cohorts are slightly bigger this summer there will be different choices at each activity session. However, it will still not be possible this summer to repeat certain activities daily, as this would mean that we would not be able to assure that each child has the equal possibility to take part in the entire activity program.

## 9. How will the cohorts be assigned?

The cohort assignment will depend on the age groups. Room or group requests made at registration will also be taken into account.

## 10. What will happen when there is a suspected case of the Corona virus?

Should a child show typical symptoms of the virus, the child and their entire cohort will be tested immediately. Simultaneously, the children's parents will be informed and if required also the responsible public health department. Until the results of the tests are available, the child will be placed in quarantine and the cohort will be isolated from the rest of the camp. Should the suspicion of an infection with the Corona virus be confirmed, the infected child should be picked up by the parents as quickly as possible. Participants who live abroad or cannot be picked up for other reasons will remain in camp quarantine if there is not an alternative.

## 11. What happens in case of non-compliance with rules and regulations?

In case of non-compliance with the hygiene/distance rules, all children are strongly advised that such a behavior is not tolerated at camp and thus endangers not only their health but also the health of the other participants and ultimately also the entire conduct of the camp. There will be a formal warning but in the event of further violation, the participant will be sent home at the expense of the parents.

We can do this together and we will all have a fabulous time at camp if everyone is careful and behaves responsible towards others! Thank you for your support and understanding

### Tests during the stay at camp

- My child has already been fully vaccinated (please present proof of vaccination at check-in)
- My child has recovered from a Covid-19 infection (please provide the positive PCR-test as a proof at check-in). The infection must have been identified more than 28 days ago but no longer than six months prior to arrival at Camp.
- I agree that my child will be tested during the stay at camp whenever necessary. The tests will be carried out by trained staff.
- I want my child to test himself under supervision and I will provide her/him with a sufficient number of self-tests (2 tests for a one-week-stay, 5 tests for a two-week-stay and 8 tests for a three-week-stay)

Please note that at least one of the options listed above must be ticked in order for your child to participate in the camp.

***By signing below, I indicate that the answers above are accurate. I have truthfully filled out the health checklist and have read the Corona FAQs and have discussed the contents with my child. I also agree that in case my child is tested positive for Covid-19, Camp Adventure is allowed to pass our contact details to the responsible public health authority.***
